



## Celebrating new citizens & discussing Canadian citizenship

Local volunteers to welcome 45 new Canadians from 21 countries at a community citizenship ceremony at the Royal BC Museum

In celebration of Canada's Citizenship Week, on Monday, October 21, the Institute for Canadian Citizenship (ICC) and Citizenship and Immigration Canada (CIC) will welcome and celebrate 45 new Canadians from 21 countries at a <u>special</u> <u>community citizenship ceremony</u> at the Royal BC Museum.

Prior to the ceremony, the ICC will hold another in its series of community-led roundtable discussions organized by its local volunteer committee. The roundtable is a unique experience where members of the community (from neighbours to business professionals and city leaders) are invited to guide a conversation with new citizens that encourages the sharing of stories and a collective reflection on Canadian citizenship. One new citizen, Ilyana, had this to say about the experience: *"When I arrived this morning I was excited for me and my family. After the roundtable discussions, I became excited for everyone in the room."*
